Spitalfields Christ Church

Customer: Coniston Ltd

The Nicholas Hawksmoor's Christ was built between 1714 -1729.

Closed in 1956 and after vigorous campaigning, from the poet Sir John Betjeman among others, eventually saved this city landmark from demolition.

After decades of fundraising, Spitalfields Christ Church was restored to its pre-1850 condition, working from the original building documents where possible, a process that stretched over more than 25 years.

AATi supplied three different products including;

1. Anti-slip stair nosings
2. Ventilation grilles
3. Cable access covers (bespoke)

All of these products were supplied in Cast Iron and complete with black zinc plating treatment (*pictured below*). AATi worked very closely with Architects Dow Jones and also building contactor Coniston Ltd to design the exact product assembly components.
